What is the objectives of the Transversal Provincial Bursary?

Who can be funded by the Transversal Provincial Bursary?

The financially needy applicants who are performing academically well.

- Those who completed Grade 12 and have been accepted for further studies at a registered Higher Education Institution
- Enrolled students at accredited Higher Education Institutions who are excelling academically

Combined household income determines the sliding scale of maximum amounts the student may qualify for:

- R0 - R350 000.00 per annum - maximum bursary of R100 000.00
- R350 001.00 - R550 000 per annum - maximum bursary of R80 000.00
- R550 001.00 - R750 000.00 per annum - maximum of R60 000.00
- Above R750 001.00 per annum - maximum of R50 000.00
