NYDA IN THE NORTHERN CAPE PROVIDING SUPPORT TO THE YOUTH

n an effort to offer relief to youth owned businesses affected by COVID-19, the National Youth Development Agency (NYDA) introduced the Youth Micro Enterprise Relief Fund, which offered relief grants to youth owned businesses to the maximum of R10 000.00 to cover operational costs during the lockdown period.

Before the closing date of 31 May 2020, a total of 120 applications were received and of this 40 have been successful in accessing the fund thus far. Others are still being processed whilst a few were rejected for a variety of reasons.

With the start of level three, all NYDA offices resumed operations albeit with skeleton staff, working on a rotational basis. Although the agency is still not allowing walk-in clients into their premises, NYDA is currently in the process of making the offices ready and compliant from an Occupational Health and Safety perspective to receive walk-in clients, so as to give the youth access to a full basket of products and services offered at the branches.

The outreach bus which is a mobile office is also being prepared to be COVID-19 OHS compliant so that it can go out to render services to youth in the rural parts of the province.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES AT THE DEPARTMENT OF ROADS AND PUBLIC WORKS





The Phakamile Mabija Artisanship Programme sets to train youth in becoming electricians, diesel mechanics, boilermakers, fitters & turners and millwrights.

The programme stretches over three years of which phase one and two are institutional and theoretical training while phase three entails workplace training. Phase four allows for revision, preparation and completion of a trade test.

Currently 24 women from five districts are enrolled and will obtain a red seal qualification that is internationally recognized during November 2020. Out of 67 apprentices, 59 successfully completed the programme and obtained work opportunities in the private and mining sector.

Through this programme and in alignment with government's mandate, action is being taken against the triple burden of poverty, inequality and unemployment.

Furthermore, the Energy and Water Sector Education and Training Authority awarded the Department a discretionary grant to the value of R8,6 million to develop and train 170 unemployed youth in the trade of Electrical Engineering Renewable Energy equivalent to NQF Level Three. The learnership intends to commence in July 2020.

The Department was awarded a Discretionary Grant worth R10 million by the Manufacturing, Engineering and Related Services Sector Education and Training Authority (MERSETA) which are invested towards the training of 60 youth towards becoming qualified riggers, welders, refrigeration and diesel mechanics.

In a quest to fight scarce skills in the province, these are just but some of the departments' initiatives to eradicate poverty, unemployment and inequality amongst youth.

The Discover the Northern Cape virtual Experience is aimed at enhancing and developing the programming skills of our youth. Technology can create many opportunities for our youth, from job creation in spheres such as gaming, coding and cyber research but also entrepreneurial opportunities such as development of gaming platforms, web development, social media development for many industries and businesses including tourism.

We have partnered with the young developing team known as Geelkucha who has developed the virtual tour experience. The creation of the virtual tour afforded the team an opportunity to put their developing and programming skills to work. The participating youth will have the opportunity to learn more about the tourism offering of the province, the importance of tourism to the economy as well as stimulating their digital competency.

The Youth will further be informed on any available national opportunities that are available for them during the COVID-19 lockdown through virtual webinars and meetings, and funding opportunities.
