A Nation that works, for all

President Cyril Ramaphosa delivered the State of the Nation Address (SONA) 2025 on 6 February at Cape Town City Hall, outlining key national priorities and their impact on provinces, including the Northern Cape.

Key Takeaways for the Northern Cape

- **Infrastructure Investment & Water Security**
 - Government is prioritizing infrastructure development, including roads, water supply, and renewable energy projects.
 - The National Water Resource Infrastructure Agency is being established to drive investment in water projects, crucial for the drought-prone Northern Cape














Key Takeaways for the Northern Cape

2. Economic Growth & Job Creation

- The government is unlocking R100 billion for infrastructure financing and expanding support for small businesses.
- The province is poised to benefit from the African Continental Free Trade Agreement, positioning it as a key player in trade and logistics.

3. Energy & Mining Sector Growth

- The Electricity Regulation Amendment Act paves the way for more renewable energy investments, a major opportunity for the Northern Cape's solar and wind energy industry.
- A new mining rights system will unlock further investment, ensuring job creation and beneficiation of minerals in the province.

4. Public Service & Governance

- A graduate recruitment scheme will attract skilled youth to government roles.
- Local government reforms aim to improve service delivery, especially in municipalities struggling with infrastructure maintenance.

5. Social Protection & Education

- The Social Relief of Distress Grant is being expanded, helping vulnerable residents.
- TVET colleges will focus on artisan training to boost employment, and efforts to improve early childhood education continue.

6. Security & Crime Prevention

- Expansion of Operation Shanela to combat crime, including illegal mining, is expected to benefit the Northern Cape.
- The SAPS is strengthening its Detective Service to improve crime-solving capacity in the province. The Northern Cape stands to gain from these national initiatives, fostering economic growth, job creation, and improved service delivery for residents.




Transformation of the Groblershoop Community Health Centre into a 24-hour Facility





SECOND CHANCE Matric Support Programme 2025


Among the industry experts guiding participants is Evelyn
