On March 6, 2025, Northern Cape Premier Dr. Zamani Saul delivered the state of the Province Address (SOPA) at the Mittah Seperepere Convention Center in Kimberley.

The address focused on several key priorities for the Province including:

- Infrastructure Development: Plans were outlined to upgrade the Upington airport to enhance its status as a central transport hub. Additionally a R2.5 billion investment in water infrastructure in Sol Plaatje Municipality aims to address ongoing water crises and transform Kimberley into a major construction site.
- Renewable Energy initiatives: The Premier highlighted the importance of upgrading the power grid through investments from Eskom, positioning the Province as leaders in renewable energy and the green economy.
- Economic Growth and Job Creation: The provincial government

plans to stimulate the economy by focusing on job creation especially in sectors such as mining, agriculture, and infrastructure. This is part of a broader strategy to reduce poverty and unemployment. Additionally, the Northern Cape aims to leverage the State-Owned Construction Company to establish a large-scale construction hub, providing more jobs and growth opportunities for the province.

Education and Healthcare: The Premier outlined the efforts to enhance education and healthcare services, including the construction of new schools and health facilities, as well as improving the existing services to better meet the needs of communities.

Overall, the address aimed to create a vision of a more prosperous, equitable, and sustainable Northern Cape, with concerted efforts in education, health, economic development and social justice









remier of the Northern Cape, Dr. Zamani Saul hosted an extended Lekgotla on Monday, 3 March 2025, emphasising on systems thinking and strategic execution to drive progress in the Northern Cape.

A few key achievements from the 6th administration reflected on in the Lekgotla:

- R35 billion economic growth in 5 years from R117bn in 2019 to R152bn in 2024
- 19 new schools & 11 new clinics built, improving education & healthcare! -
- 84% Matric pass rate a massive 18% increase since 2020!
- R25 billion investment in infrastructure to create jobs & transform the province
- 8 clean audits proof of good governance & accountability

FUN FACT? The Northern Cape will be hosting the G20 energy stream in April, putting Kimberley on the global stage as it will be their first gathering in Africa. Previously hosted in India (2023), Bali, Indonesia (2022), Rome, Italy (2021), Oska, Japan (2019) and Hamburg, Germany (2017).

Validation Workshop on the White Paper on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities & the Job Access Strategic Framework



he Office on the Status of Persons with
Disabilities (OSPD) unit within the OTP hosted a
Validation Workshop on the White Paper on the
Rights of Persons with Disabilities (WPRPD) and
the Job Access Strategic Framework (JASF) on
27–28 February 2025.

The workshop brought together sector departments, district municipalities, and Disabled People's Organisations (DPOs) to assess progress in implementing disability rights policies and frameworks.

The workshop was officially opened by Mr. Mantantana, Director: Provincial Transformation Programmes, who emphasised the importance of the workshop in strengthening accountability, fostering collaboration, and ensuring that government efforts align with the principles of disability inclusion and equal opportunities.

A pivotal session of the workshop featured Mr. Pillay, who provided an overview of the WPRPD and JASF, focusing on their core pillars and their significance in guiding the Northern Cape Provincial Government's service delivery approach for the disability sector.

During the second session, the Manager of the OSPD unit, Ms Kenosi Sebico provided an analysis of the implementation reports submitted over the past three quarters, offering detailed feedback on progress, challenges, and areas requiring improvement.

The validation workshop proved to be a resounding success, fostering critical dialogue and reinforcing government's commitment to ensuring the full inclusion, empowerment, and protection of persons with disabilities in the Northern Cape.

THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE AND CONSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT OFFICIALLY LAUNCHED THE PAMPIERSTAD SMALL CLAIM COURT



The Pampierstad Imbizo was themed under *Strengthening*Access to Justice Through Community Engagement, following the successful launch of the Pampierstad Small Claim Court.

Deputy Ministers, Andries Nel and Nocawe Mhlauli, led a discussion with residents from four local wards offering a platform for them to voice concerns and propose solutions towards improving justice services.

Key figures from various sectors attended the Imbizo, including government officials, judiciary representatives and traditional leaders. The gathering highlighted the significance of better collaboration between customary and statutory justice systems including the role of different stakeholders in enhancing service delivery.

This initiative aims to provide greater access to justice, allowing community members, particularly those unable to afford legal representation, to resolve disputes quickly and affordable. The Small Claims Court will enable individuals to claim up to R20 000 without requiring a lawyer, making justice more accessible for the people of Pampierstad.


