Policy Aim

 The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance on the consultation, referrals¹ or transfer of patients to other health care facilities/ health professionals² for diagnostic imaging³ services when deemed medically necessary by a doctor.

Policy Scope

2. This policy applies to all health professionals and patients of the Northern Cape Department of Health.

Policy Statement

- 3. It is the policy of the Northern Cape Department of Health that:
 - 3.1. The referral of patients for diagnostic imaging be formalised and regulated.
 - 3.1.1. The referring practitioner must have examined the patient and noticed a need to refer the patient for diagnostic imaging; such information must be communicated to the specialist or consultant that the patient is referred to.
 - 3.1.2. The referral must be in writing on the appropriate x-ray forms and should be signed by a referring practitioner.
 - 3.1.3. The specialist or consultant to whom the patient is referred to must have received the referral letter on or prior to the occasion of the professional service required/ to which the referral relates.
 - 3.2. All health professionals entitled to refer patients for imaging procedures may request a diagnostic imaging service.

¹ Referrals means a request by a specialist, consultant physician for investigation, opinion, treatment and/ or management of a condition or problem of a patient for

² Health professionals refers to Medical Doctors, Allied Workers and Professional Nurses, Dentist and Chiropractor

³ Diagnostic imaging service refers to x-ray, computerized tomography scans, ultrasound scans, magnetic resonance imaging and nuclear scans)

3.3. The internal, external, public and private patients may be referred for diagnostic imaging.

3.4. Provision of Diagnostic Imaging

- 3.4.1. A diagnostic imaging service may be provided only by health professionals who are appropriately trained and registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa (HPCSA) in Radiography or Radiology; such health professionals may operate x-ray equipment and perform examinations within their scope of practice.
- 3.4.2. The Radiographer / Radiologist must receive a signed and dated request x-ray form from the requesting practitioner who deemed the service necessary to assist with the correct diagnose.
- 3.5. Tertiary, Regional, District Hospitals and Community Health Centres (CHC) render Diagnostic Imaging Services.

3.6. Referrals pathways

- 3.6.1. Primary Health Care refers to CHC
- 3.6.2. CHC refers to District Hospitals
- 3.6.3. District Hospital refers to Regional or Tertiary Hospitals
- 3.6.4. Patients from Regional hospital and District hospital must be referred to specialised clinics at the tertiary hospital for examination before referring them to a specialist or consultant except emergency cases i.e. accidents
- 3.7. Health facilities render services according to the service package they offer.
 - 3.7.1. Tertiary hospital offers MRI, CT, Fluoroscopy, Interventional radiography, general radiography, mammogram, dental and ultrasonography –Doppler.
 - 3.7.2. Regional Hospital offers CT, Fluoroscopy, general radiography, mammogram, dental and ultrasonography-Doppler

- 3.7.3. District Hospitals offer general radiography, dental and ultrasonography.
- 3.7.4. CHC offers general radiography

3.8. Licensing of Health Facilities Undertaking Diagnostic Imaging Procedures

- 3.8.1. All health facilities equipment performing diagnostic imaging must be registered with the Department of Health, Radiation Control Directorate according to the Hazardous Substance Act No: 15 of 1973⁴.
- 3.8.2. All health facilities have to comply with the radiation protection, quality control and the licensing regulation.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4. The responsibilities are outlined as follows:-
 - 4.1. The **Chief Executive Officers** and Hospital Managers must ensure that the radiation protection requirements are adhered to as stipulated in the Regulation of the Radiation Control⁵.

4.2. The Deputy Director for Radiology must:-

- 4.2.1. Conduct regular audits to assess the correct usage of protective clothing and the safety of patients during x-ray examination.
- 4.2.2. Provide reports to the district, hospital managers and the radiographer regarding the findings of assessment.
- 4.2.3. Advise hospital managers on radiation protection measures.
- 4.2.4. Conduct information sessions regarding the rights and safety of patients during x-ray examination.
- 4.2.5. Perform quality control on x-ray machines.

Review and Distribution

- 5. The Deputy Director for Radiology is the responsible manager for this policy and for ensuring it is reviewed and updated.
- 6. This policy will be reviewed after 3 year but no later than 5 years after the last publishing date. If necessary an updated version will be issued, if not a formal cover letter will be issued to supplement the cover of this Policy (identifying a revised publication date).
- 7. The Director for Policy & Planning will distribute updated versions to:
 - Member of the Executive Council for Health
 - Head of Department of Health
 - All Chief Directors, Directors and Deputy Directors (who will in turn distribute to their staff as appropriate.)
