NORTHERN CAPE CRIME STATISTICS FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF THE 2024/25 FINANCIAL YEAR

NORTHERN CAPE GOVERNMENT ENSURES HEALTH AND SAFETY WITH TUCK-SHOP INSPECTIONS







he Northern Cape Government is taking proactive steps to protect public health by conducting inspections of tuck shops across the province.

On Monday, 24 February 2025, inspections led by South African Police Service(SAPS), Department of Social Development, Department of Health and National Prosecuting Authority(NPA) were conducted In Warrenton, with aims to ensure that food vendors comply with hygiene and safety regulations.

Authorities check for proper food storage, cleanliness, and expiration dates to prevent foodborne illnesses. Businesses found violating health regulations receive warnings or penalties to encourage compliance.

By enforcing strict health standards, the government is safeguarding consumers, especially schoolchildren who rely on tuck shops for daily snacks and homes for staple foods. These inspections not only promote healthier communities but also support responsible business practices.

The initiative reflects the province's commitment to public safety and quality food standards. Residents are encouraged to report any concerns, ensuring that all tuck shops maintain high levels of hygiene and safety.



NORTHERN CAPE GOVERNMENT ENSURES ROAD SAFETY WITH INSPECTIONS ON THE N12 ENROUTE TO WARRENTON

The Northern Cape Government is prioritizing public safety through ongoing road inspections along the N12 in Warrenton.

These inspection conducted by Government Communications Information Systems(GCIS), National Prosecution Agency(NPA), Department of Justice and Department of Social Development, aim to ensure that vehicles meet roadworthiness standards and that drivers comply with traffic laws, alongside spreading awareness of Human Trafficking, Gender-based Violence and Anti-corruption. Thuthuzela Care Centre also joined forces to this programme.

By handing out leaflets, conversing with travellers and raiding cars, the Northern Cape Government is enforcing measures of keeping the community safe.



he recent visit by the COGHSTA Frances Baard Regional Office to Platfontein, !Xunkhwesa Combined School aimed to address significant challenges impacting local students. This includes drug abuse, teenage pregnancy, and absenteeism due to menstruation. The initiative, in collaboration with the South African Police Service (SAPS) and the Department of Social Development, was prompted by findings from the Community Development Workers (CDW).

An interactive session allowed students to engage directly with stakeholders, who offered guidance on how to tackle these issues. A notable part of the intervention was the distribution of over 1000 sanitary towels, ensuring that students had access to necessary hygiene products and reducing absenteeism related to menstruation.

This intervention is part of ongoing efforts to support students in overcoming obstacles and ensuring a healthier, more supportive learning environment.
